Special Area Report 2nd Quarter STEM

Kindergarten

- We jumped into Augmented Reality with the Quiver app. We created art that came to life. We also went on a virtual field trip to identify the location and significance of well-known sites and landmarks in the United States including Mt. Rushmore, The White House, Lincoln Memorial, and the Statue of Liberty.
- We designed, built, tested, and improved simple machines to push and pull rocks up a ramp. We talked about simple machines and how they make work easier.
- We read the book <u>Ten Timid Ghosts</u> and worked on counting backwards from 10. We then designed and built haunted houses to house our own ghosts. The houses had to be free standing and tall enough for the ghost to stand in.

First Grade

- We jumped into Augmented Reality with the Quiver app. We created art that came to life. We also went on a virtual field trip to identify the location and significance of well-known sites and landmarks in the United States including Mt. Rushmore, The White House, Lincoln Memorial, and the Statue of Liberty.
- We designed and created a model for parts of a plant. We discussed plant parts and their functions.
- We designed, built, tested, and improved catapults to launch pumpkins at targets. We discussed simple machines and how they make work easier. We also discussed trajectory and force as they related to launching the pumpkins.

Second/Third

- We jumped into Augmented Reality with the Quiver app. We created art that came to life. We also went on a virtual field trip to identify the location and significance of well-known sites and landmarks in the United States including Mt. Rushmore, The White House, Washington Monument, Lincoln Memorial, and the Statue of Liberty.
- We built Lego towers to withstand an earthquake. We discussed earthquakes as natural disasters and the impact on humans and the environment.
- We designed, built, tested, and improved cars made from random materials. The purpose was to build a car that rolls. We discussed the simple machine, wheel and axle, and the importance of basic machines to make work easier. Did you know a door knob is a wheel and axle?

Lobby Guard

If you are a frequent visitor to our school, you may purchase a Lobby Guard key fob which will allow you to swipe in more quickly each time you come to the school. The cost is \$5 and the fobs will work at all Maryville City schools and can be reused each year (at no additional charge) by swiping in your most recent ID at the beginning of each school year. SANTA CALLS THE CHILDREN DEC. 4 - AGES 3-5 DEC. 6 - AGES 6-7



The Parks & Recreation Commission has made special arrangements for Santa Claus to telephone your children. Gifts are not provided. It is only through the efforts of the Maryville-Alcoa Civitans that Santa is able to reach all the children of our area. Because of the hundreds of children Santa must reach each year, we ask that you read the following instructions carefully:

- This program is designed for children 3-7 years of age. If children over 7 would seriously enjoy a call from ≽ Santa, please include them. Families with both age ranges may be called on the same night. Please specify on the form below which night you want Santa to call.
- Calls will be made only on the dates listed.
- Calls will be made from 5-9 p.m. All efforts will be made to make calls as early in the evening as possible, but ≻ due to the number of calls, sometimes your call may come close to the 9 p.m. hour. For those who go to bed early, parents are asked to list the latest time the child will be awake.
- Parents please do not ask older brothers and sisters to answer the phone, they tend to become argumentative.
- Santa will make calls all applicants. However, if the child cannot be reached, the line is busy, no answer, etc., a second attempt will be made, but only after every child on the list has been called once. Those not reached on the first night will be added to the bottom of the stack for the 2nd night of calling and will be done only as time allows
- Ages 3-5 will receive calls on Tuesday, Dec. 4th with ages 6-7 receiving calls on Thursday, Dec. 6th.
- Parents are asked not to indicate to children in advance which evening Santa will call in case the child is unable to be reached.
- ⊳ Only one family per form. Forms are available at the Parks and Recreation office on our website @ www.parksrec.com. No long distance calls will be made.
