# Special area report for Music 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter 2018-2019

**Kindergarten**-Students will sing, dance, play rhythm games and experiment with instruments. Kindergarten students will practice four ways to use their voice. Students will whisper, talk, sing and discuss appropriate situations to shout. Students will dance and decide if they are moving to the beat or rhythm of a song. Students will discuss character, plot, and setting with the Halloween story song "Pumpkin Bones". Students will learn lyrics to patriotic songs for Veteran's Day. Students will sing number songs, rhyming songs and count syllables to the beat of music. Students will discuss holiday customs and sing holiday songs from around the world.

**First Grade**-Students will discuss the meter of 2,3 and 4. Students will listen to songs and identify changing meter. Using their knowledge of strong and weak beats students will determine the meter of a song. Students will practice rhythm with games, singing, instruments and movement. Students will discuss character, setting and plot with seasonal Halloween songs. Patriotic songs will be practiced and preformed for families and guests on November 9<sup>th</sup>. Students will create their own holiday lyrics and sing traditional holiday music.

**Second Grade**-Students will focus on strong and weak beats. Students will review meter of 2/4, 3/4 and 4/4. Students will distinguish between beat and rhythm in songs. Students will sing, participate in movement games and play instruments to the beat and rhythm of music. Students will participate in call and response activities with drum circles and folk songs. Students will collaborate to compose short songs and preform them for their peers. Students will create ostinatos with partners and teach them to other students. Students will learn holiday songs for Veteran's Day, Thanksgiving and Christmas.

**Third Grade**-Students will identify the meter sign and differentiate between the meter of 2,3 and 4. Students will explore different ranges and voices in music. Students will create and preform ostinatos with classmates. Students will learn parts of the musical alphabet. Students will listen to and participate in songs with rounds. Students will learn seasonal songs for Thanksgiving and Christmas. Students will use a drum circle for call and response activities to review concepts covered in classroom lessons. Students will be responsible for memorizing two songs. One song is about kindness, the other about organization.
